OUR HISTORY

In 1976, we began as a grassroots domestic violence crisis hotline. Quickly, counseling services for victims of abuse became necessary, so we hired our first mental health therapists.

In 1988, responding to research and our own recognition that breaking the cycle of violence must include youth, we developed Project HART (Healthy Alternatives for Relationships among Teens).

In 2007, we evolved from serving only women to serving teens and adults, inclusive of gender, gender identity, gender expression and sexual orientation and changed our name to Safe Connections.

OUR LOGO



The Safe Connections logo features the Lotus flower. A symbol of purity and rebirth across many cultures and religions. In murky waters, Lotus flowers grow from the mud and ultimately rise above the surface of the water as a beautiful bloom and is a symbol for the work Safe Connections does to help survivors rebuild and reclaim their lives after abuse.

CRISIS INTERVENTION

Our 24-Hour Crisis Helpline is a live-voice helpline for the entire St. Louis region, 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. Highly-trained advocates assess safety needs, assist with safety planning, provide emergency transportation, and give referrals for medical care, shelter, legal aid, counseling, and other area resources. Our Helpline is there for adults and youth of all genders who have experienced rape, domestic or dating abuse (physical, sexual or emotional), sex trafficking, and/or childhood sexual abuse. The Crisis Helpline is also an excellent resource for friends and family members who are concerned for a loved one.

Safe Connections arranges over-the-phone interpreters to translate more than 140 languages for Crisis Helpline callers. For callers who are Deaf or hard of hearing, RELAY services are available 24/7 by dialing 711.

INDIVIDUAL THERAPY

Safe Connections offers individual therapy free of charge to adults and youth of all genders ages 12+ who have experienced rape, domestic or dating abuse (physical, sexual or emotional), sex trafficking, and/or childhood sexual abuse.

Compassionate and highly specialized, master's degree-level therapists help victims reclaim their lives as survivors. Additionally, clients partner with their therapists to build stability, improve mental/physical health, and create greater safety for violence-free futures.

ADULT THERAPY

Weekly individual therapy is offered for clients of all genders hurt by domestic or sexual trauma in the past or present. Traumas addressed include sexual assault/rape; physical, emotional, mental or financial abuse; stalking; human trafficking; past childhood sexual abuse; or family neglect.

TEEN THERAPY

Safe Connections offers individual counseling to teens of all genders. We work with teens who have been impacted by abuse or sexual violence at home, school or elsewhere. Safe Connections also serves teens who have been bullied and harassed about their sexual orientation or gender identity. Services are available at schools, other youth-serving sites and at Safe Connections.

SUPPORT SERVICES

Safe Connections offers a variety of groups for adults and youth. These complement individual counseling or can be accessed as stand-alone services. Participants gain a social circle and build knowledge and skills in a safe and healing environment.

Safe Connections' support services are regularly updated based on best practices in the field and the changing needs of clients. Adult groups include:

- Dialectical Behavior Therapy (DBT)
- Expressive Therapy Groups

PREVENTION EDUCATION



PROJECT HART

Healthy Alternatives for Relationships Among Teens is a relationship violence prevention program made up of interactive workshops to give teens the knowledge and skills to develop healthy relationships. Project HART serves teens in middle schools, high schools, and alternative school settings.

Sample Topics: Healthy Relationships • Teen Dating Violence • Technology and Relationships • Sexual Assault Awareness • Bystander Intervention • Survivor Support • Understanding Gender • LGBTQ Awareness Series

GUYS GROUPS

Guys Group uses activities and guided, small-group discussions to explore and expand young men's beliefs about teen relationships, relationship violence and masculinity. Through Guys Group, middle- and high-school-age boys learn how to strengthen their own behaviors and serve as peer leaders advocating against a culture of violence toward women and girls.

GIRLS GROUPS

Girls Group is a small-group curriculum that uses activities and guided discussions to explore and expand young women's attitudes and beliefs about teen relationships, relationship violence and self-respect. These groups help girls ages 12-19 use what they learn to navigate their own relationships and support peers to make healthy relationship decisions.

SAFE CONNECTIONS ON CAMPUS

Safe Connections on Campus engages college students in the work to end relationship and sexual violence—on and off campus.

This initiative provides a forum for discussion and the exchange of ideas among colleges and universities in the St. Louis area. Additionally, Safe Connections on Campus offers students the opportunity to take action on their home campus and to connect with students from other area schools.

Students, faculty and staff from various post-secondary institutions come together to build relationships, share information and plan campus activities that raise awareness about relationship and sexual violence and provide resources for those seeking help.

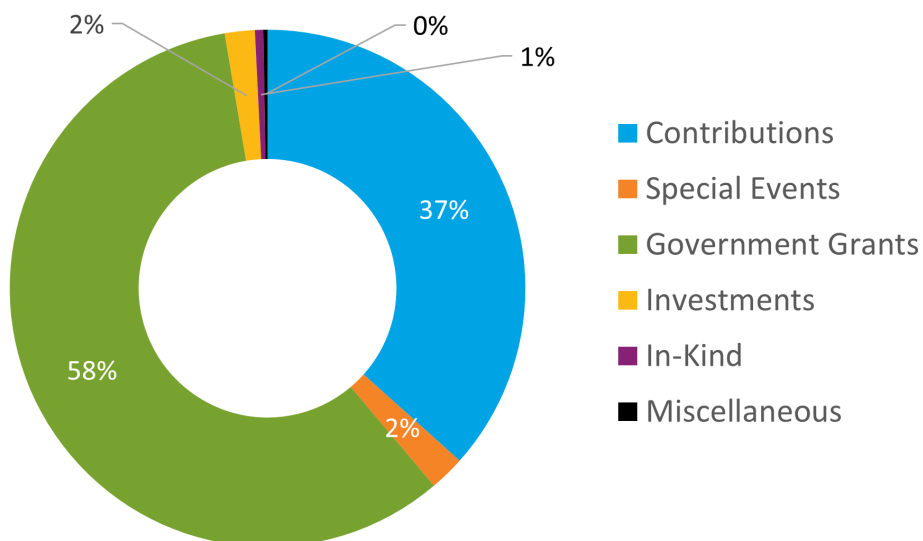

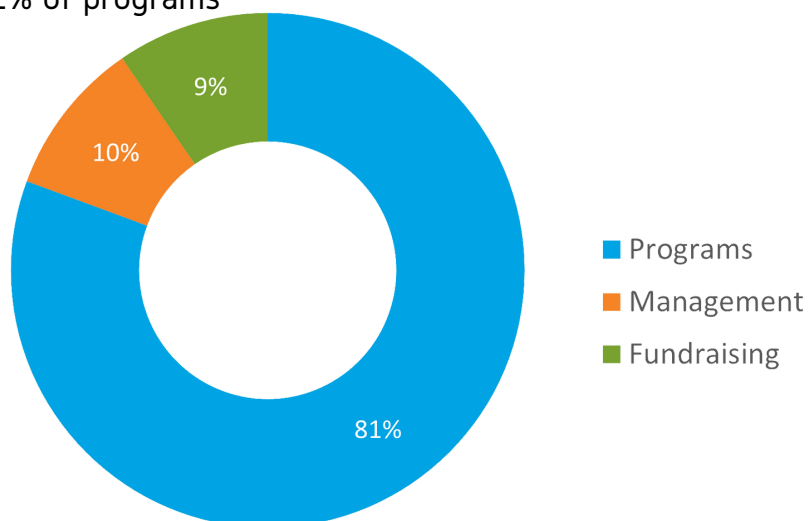

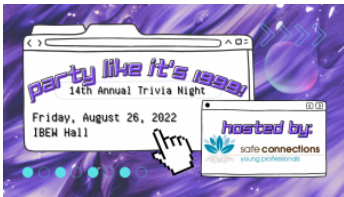

Susan D. Kidder, M.S.

Following a long career of public service and nonprofit executive leadership, Susan Kidder, Safe Connections' Chief Executive Officer retired April 30, 2021.

Susan served as the CEO of Safe Connections for 14 years. She is a visionary, a champion for women and girls, and she continues to be tenacious in her advocacy.

Susan joined Safe Connections in 2007, relocating from Chicago. She grew up in Springfield, Illinois, earned her Bachelor's degree from Illinois State University and her Master's degree from Eastern Illinois University. She holds a certificate in Business Management for Nonprofit Leaders from Washington University Olin Business School. Susan, in addition, is a 2013-14 graduate of Leadership St. Louis.

Susan previous positions include serving as Executive Director for Literacy Chicago, National Marketing Director for Hitec Group International, Executive Director for Chicago Hearing Society, Associate Executive Director for Lake County Society for Human Development, Director of Rehabilitation Services for Moultrie County Rehabilitation Center; and Vocational Evaluator for Vermilion county Rehabilitation Center.

In 2017, Susan was one of two women across the state honored by the Missouri Women's Network for her leadership in advancing women's equality. In 2019, Susan was selected for a Diverse Business Leaders award by the St. Louis Business Journal.

During Susan's tenure, Safe Connections achieved many accomplishments: agency re-branding; creating guys groups, crisis counseling support program, and young professionals group. She grew Safe Connections on Campus, volunteer recruitment and retention, and began serving those who identify as men or male.

Susan will forever be a part of Safe Connections. The organization is where it is today because of Susan D. Kidder.
